TRANSPORTATION		Resident must have a community bus pass. Transportation will be provided for those who are receiving assistance with mental/ health care coordination, appointments and life skills-grocery shopping. Transportation may not exceed 5 round trips per month. Round Trips may not exceed 30 miles.
TOLITRIES		Residents will be provided with the following monthly: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Six – rolls of toilet paper • One box of Pads or Tampons (FEMALES ONLY) • One bottle of liquid soap or 2 bars of soap • One tube of tooth past • One bottle of lotion • One can of deodorant • One bottle of shampoo • One bottle of conditioner • One bottle of laundry detergent
MOTHERS WITH CHILDREN AND OR PREGNANT		MOTHER + ONE CHILD OR PREGNANT MOTHER Mother will be provided with resources and assistance if needed to sign up for WIC, Food Stamps & childcare. Assisting mother to coordinate appointments for child and or pregnancy.
BED HOLD	Per Day	Bed Holds can be requested for individuals that have chosen to reside at the Therapeutic Independent Living Home, but will not move in immediately and would like to reserve a bed until they are able to move in.
